SUBJECT: Nomination of a Representative to California Special District Association

Board of Directors

RECOMMENDATION

Board discussion and action regarding the nomination of a representative to the California Special District Association (CSDA) Board of Directors.

BACKGROUND

CSDA is seeking nominations for representatives to their Board of Directors (Attachment 1). Donner Summit Public Utility District (DSPUD) is in the Sierra Network and the term for Seat B has ended. CSDA is accepting nominations from member districts in the Sierra Network for this seat. DSPUD may nominate one of its' own Board members or General Manager for the CSDA Board. The incumbent to this seat is Jerry Kilmore from Truckee Sanitary District and he is running for re-election.

Members of the CSDA Board need to be interested in the issues confronting special districts state wide and are expected to:

- Attend all board meetings, usually 4-5 meetings annually, at the CSDA office in Sacramento.
- Participate on at least one committee, meets 3-5 times a year at the CSDA office in Sacramento.
 - (CSDA reimburses directors for their related expenses for board and committee meetings as outlined in board policy).
- Attend, at minimum, the following CSDA annual events:
 - Special Districts Legislative Days held in the Spring
 - CSDA Annual Conference held in the Summer/Fall.
- Complete all four modules of CSDA's Special District Leadership Academy within 2 years of being elected.

Note: CSDA does not reimburse expenses for the CSDA conferences or academy classes even if a board or committee meeting is held in conjunction with the event.

Nominations are due by April 11, 2025. Once nominations are collected, CSDA will begin electronic voting on June 10, 2025.

The deadline for receiving nominations in the Northern Network is April 21, 2025. The deadline for receiving nominations in all other Networks is April 11, 2025.

The Elections and Bylaws Committee is looking for Independent Special District Board Members or their General Managers who are interested leading the direction of the California Special Districts Association for the 2026 - 2028 term.

The leadership of CSDA is elected from its six geographical networks. Each of the six networks has three seats on the Board with staggered 3 terms. Candidates must be affiliated with an independent special district that is a CSDA Regular Member in good standing and located within t geographic network that they seek to represent.

The CSDA Board of Directors is the governing body responsible for all policy decisions related to CSDA's member services, legislative advoca professional development, and other resources for members. The Board of Directors is crucial to the operation of the Association and to the representation of the common interests of all California's special districts before the Legislature and the State Administration. Serving on the B requires one's interest in the issues confronting special districts statewide.

Commitment and Expectations:

- Attend all Board meetings, usually 4-5 meetings annually, at the CSDA office in Sacramento.
- Participate on at least one committee, meets 3-5 times a year at the CSDA office in Sacramento.
 (CSDA reimburses Directors for their related expenses for Board and committee meetings as outlined in Board policy).
- Attend, at minimum, the following CSDA annual events: Special Districts Legislative Days held in the spring, and the CSDA Annual Con-- held in the fall.
 - (CSDA does not reimburse expenses for the two conferences even if a Board or committee meeting is held in conjunction with the event).
- Complete all four modules of CSDA's Special District Leadership Academy within 2 years of being elected.
 (CSDA does not reimburse expenses for the Academy classes even if a Board or committee meeting is held in conjunction with the event).

Nomination Procedures: Any Regular Member district in good standing is eligible to nominate one person, a board member or managerial er (as defined by that district's Board of Directors), for election to the CSDA Board of Directors. A copy of the member district's resolution or r action and Candidate Information Sheet must accompany the nomination. The deadline for receiving nominations in the Northern No is April 21, 2025. The deadline for receiving nominations in all other Networks is April 11, 2025. Nominations and supporting docume may be mailed or emailed.
